REDEEMING GENERATIONS



In the course of 6 days our dedicated team embarked on a school and prison ministry where we targeted 100 schools and 7 prison facilities but managed to reach out to 69 schools and 4 prison facilities and through our out-reach efforts, we were able to reach out to 53,034 individuals winning over **41,361 souls** to Christ.

Our objectives:

- To spread the message of salvation and hope through Jesus Christ.
- To engage with both the students and inmates with spiritual and moral guidance and support.
- **Strategies Employed.**

- Partnered with Scripture Union eastern region to maximize reach out and effectiveness.
- Engaged with prison staff to facilitate smooth operations and gain trust.
- Used personal testimonies to capture and resonate with audiences and also ensured messages were relatable and relevant like the
 - "Okya'gasa" (your still valuable) theme in prison facilities and 'I am special' in schools based on Psalms 139:13-14.
- Encouraged the new converts in schools to GROW (*Go to church, Read the Bible, Obey the word of God and Witness to other*). For the students and pupils, we encouraged them to join Scripture Union clubs for their personal spiritual growth.

The mission week commenced on the 2nd of June 2024, a team of 22 people comprising of LSSI and Mbale SU

Our team was instrumental in providing both spiritual and behavioral guidance, mentorship and support to the students and inmates facing various challenges through the Life Skills Programme thus we have been able to reach hearts and minds with the message of one's identity in Christ through both the "I am special theme in schools and the okya'gasa" (your valuable) theme in prisons.

Repeated scenarios happened in various schools where students were touched by the testimonies that were shared by the evangelists that resulted into giving their lives to Christ for transformation.

"In a one AMUS College school a student walked up to one of us and teared down thanking us for coming and sharing our testimonies since they were faced with a similar challenge and didn't know how to go about it."

Another student said they had asked God to give them a sign concerning a matter they were praying for and our going to their school with the "I am special message" was the sign they wanted.

A head teacher in Nabumali boarding school told us that our going to her school was just in the right time as she had earlier on that week sighted demonic activities in a new student and her fear was despite the student being sent away, she could have initiated many others thus our presence would cause a revival and godly spiritual awakening in her school.



The above photo is of pupils in one of the schools who as a result of this mission were bought for uniforms since they did not have school uniforms and their parents could not afford. Scholastic materials among other basic needs scarcity were sighted in many of the village schools that we went to minister into this factor affects their self-esteem and also performance thus Headteachers could not stop mentioning how helping the children obtain these could help the message reach greater depths.

By God's Grace, we managed to reach 53,034 students/pupils, 473 inmates and 41,361 (78%) school going children and 429 (91%) inmates got saved in the 69 schools both primary and secondary and the 4 prison facilities in Eastern Uganda.
