Another profound emotional scene for me happened in Kyenjojo main prison where the inmates sought the pastors touch in hopes of experiencing release and redemption. Among them, the prison pastor received a prophetic word foretelling his own release, prompting him to embrace the pastor and weep tears of profound emotion.

Having an opportunity to speak to over 150 school heads about leadership and good governance at Britop Resort left remarkable impart with them as they were so excited to hear more and invited us into their schools next, we visited.

A team of 12 set off from Kampala to Kasese on the 3rd of March 2024, Sunday afternoon which team was joined by a team of 4 members in Kasese.

In schools our team was instrumental in providing both spiritual and behavioral guidance, mentorship and support to the students facing various challenges through the Life Skills Programme thus we have been able to reach young hearts and minds with the message of one's identity in Christ.

Through the tireless effort of the team and the Grace of God, we managed to reach over *12,914 youth* ages ranging from (14-30), *7,516 children* from ages (6-13) and *14,444* (63.4%) people got saved all in the 36 schools both primary and secondary of Western Uganda, Rwenzori Region.





15 Prison Facilities

Reached

The purpose of this prison ministration is to provide spiritual guidance and soft skills training to the inmates aiming at bringing the people to the knowledge of an also aiming to promote person growth in self-realization and identity in Christ Jesus.

Similar within the correctional facilities, our ministry was a beacon of hope to those who felt forgotten or lost. Through the group sessions and the one-on-one conversations with the inmates, we saw individuals find solace, purpose and a new direction for their lives through having faith in our Lord Jesus Christ

After our first joint school mission in Bwera secondary school in Kasese on a Monday morning the team then divided into two teams where one team handled the prison facilities and the other team handled the schools this was a very effect way.

With a general number of *2,358 inmates* reached with the gospel in the 15 prison facilities only *1,150 inmates (5%)* responded to the alter call and surrendered their lives to Christ Jesus as their personal Lord and Saviour.

"Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me; I was in prison and you came to me" Matt 25:36. An Officer- in- Charge quoted in Bubukwanga prison facility as he was so excited to see us visit his facility continuing to say that just as much as they do their work the church going to them is a good way to enable the inmates align their ways back to their creator and this will in return reduce on their work load.







FINANCIAL REPORT

The following financial report provides an overview of the revenue and expenses incurred by our prison and school ministry program during the Rwenzori mission in march.

We by the Grace of God through the Partners collected 8,000,000shs (2,053 USD) and used 7,480,000shs (1,930 USD) remaining with a balance of 520,000shs (133 USD) as summarized in the table below
