In other words, we were planning the biggest mission ever in what seemed to be the worst financial season.

# Redeeming generations

This mission was an extraordinary kind since it was the first in its nature for us as a ministry, covering 11 districts six (6) districts (*Dokolo, Alebtong, Lira city, Kwanja, Kole, Apac and Oyam*) in Lango Region and four (4) districts (*Bugiri, Iganga, Kamuli and Jinja*) in Busoga Region in a two (2) weeks time space.

The mission started on Sunday the 22nd of September 2024 as the team set off into the Lango region after service at 1pm. we had a target of reaching and covering over 350 schools and 20 prisons but managed to cover only 242 schools and 14 prison facilities with a volunteer team of 35 people, and through the outreach efforts we were able to reach out to **102,493 people** winning **59,774 souls** to Christ.

## Our objectives:

- To spread the message of salvation and hope through Christ Jesus.
- To engage both the students and inmates with spiritual and moral guidance and support.

## Strategies Employed.

- Partnered with Scripture Union Lango and Busoga Region to

maximize reach out and effectiveness.

- Engaged with prison staff to help facilitate smooth operations and gain trust.
- Used personal testimonies to capture and resonate with the audiences and also ensured messages were relatable and relevant like the **“Okya’gasa” (your still valuable)** theme in Prisons and I am special in schools based on Psalms 139:13-14.
- Encouraged the new converts to GROW (**Go to church, Read the bible, Obey the word of God AND witness to others.**)
- Encouraged the new converts to join scripture union clubs if they were to grow in their new faith.

# Key achievements

- Extensive school outreach.

The outreach to 242 schools was a major part of the mission. Through age-appropriate presentations, testimonies and engaging content, students and teachers were reached with the message of the gospel. Many lives were transformed, and many people made commitments to follow Christ.

- Impactful Prison Mission.

The missions team visited 14 prisons bringing hope and transformation to those behind bars. Those serving long term sentences responded with joy to the message of grace and



forgiveness as a result giving their lives to Christ.

- Massive conversion rate.

Out of the 102,493 people reached 59,774 people gave their lives to Christ.

The seed planted through these efforts will be followed up by Scripture Union through their clubs for discipleship in their new found faith.
